Session Charges for Nursery Children September 2025

Eynsham Community Primary School Nursery fees will remain at **£18.50 per session** (see session times below). This remains very good value for money and highly competitive compared to those around us.

We will still be accepting the universal government funded 15 hours and the government funded 30 hours for those that are eligible under the Working parent eligibility. Please see the following page for more information about checking eligibility and how to apply.

Government Funded Hours

How to apply for free childcare

Your child is eligible for Universal 15 hours of free childcare from the term after their third birthday. If your child is age three or four and you want to access **15 hours of free childcare**, you don't need to make an application as your childcare provider will do this for you automatically. You'll just need to show them a copy of your child's birth certificate, and you'll also have to sign a declaration form. Talk to us to find out more!

If your child is two, three or four years old and you're eligible for the Working Parent **30 hours of free childcare**, you'll need to fill out an application form online. If you're eligible, you'll get a childcare account and a code which you'll need to show us, along with your child's date of birth and your National Insurance number. You'll need to reconfirm your details every three months, or your code will expire.

Free Education and Childcare for 2-year-olds

Your 2-year-old can get free childcare if you live in England and get any of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit (or both), and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- The Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

2-year-olds can also get free childcare if they:

- are looked after by a local authority
- have an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- get [Disability Living Allowance](#)
- have left care under an adoption order, special guardianship order or a child arrangements order

To make sure you receive your code, leave plenty of time to apply.
