Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope that you and your families have enjoyed the summer break. It is great to see the children settling into their new classes full of enthusiasm. They have returned sharing exciting memories about their time away from school, and learning all about their individual personalities and interests has been extremely exciting and rewarding this week. The new school year has got off to a 'flying' start and we have all been really impressed with how ready, respectful and responsible the children are being in our classes. Despite the big change of moving into a new year group, with a new teacher, the children have responded with fantastic resilience and once again have demonstrated how sensible, adaptable and courteous pupils at our school are, making us extremely proud to be their new teachers.

What your child's year group will be learning this term:

World War II



In this history-led topic, the children will discover why Britain became involved in the Second World War and which countries were Allies and Axis throughout. They will investigate why and how the evacuation process worked for children and the effect that this had on both the children and their parents. Over the course of these two terms, we will also be exploring rationing, the role of women, Anne Frank's diary, propaganda, the Battle of Britain and the Blitz. The children will turn into secret agents and investigate how the workers at Bletchley Park worked on various missions, as well as the work Alan Turing did with the Enigma Machine. As part of this topic, we will be visiting Didcot Railway Centre where the children will take part in a 'WW2 Evacuation' day. The children will enhance their learning all about the



evacuation to the countryside of school children during the war by experiencing it first hand – including the moving train carriage! The children will also get to experience a genuine air-raid shelter with wartime audio effects and explore a wide range of real-life artefacts.

Ways you can support your child's learning at home:

Reading - Thank you for all your continued home support with reading, we have been really pleased with the children's clear enjoyment of reading and motivation to read. Your child can use school books chosen from our class bookshelves or books from home if they prefer. Please can we ask you to find time to share a book with your child at least 3 times a week and they can record this in their new Reading Diary. When they record three reads at home within a week, they will receive a house point. Please remind your children to let us know when they have earned one and ensure to sign each read you have observed or listened to!

Maths – Every week, the children will be set a session on times table rock stars to complete. This will be a ten minute session to help them remain fluent with their tables. All children have their log in details now but if they have any problems logging in, please let us know.

Spellings – Children will be set a list of spelling words to learn each week. Words given will either follow a specific spelling pattern or they will be common exception words. This year, this list of spellings will be set on Spelling Shed where we can monitor how much the children are practising at home. The children will have exciting spelling sessions in class to reinforce the weekly word lists, prior to a test of the 10 key words each Wednesday. This will enable us to see which words are being retained by pupils and which words we need to revisit.
