Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope that you and your family had a wonderful summer break. It has been exciting to hear about some of the people and places that the children have visited! There is a lovely sense of calm around Year 6, with pupils quickly settling into their new classrooms, getting into really good routines and showing a great eagerness to learn and succeed. The children are already fulfilling their responsibility to model fantastic behaviour to the other children in our school. They are ready to work each morning and have been very respectful to the staff and to each other. Our topic about the Ancient Greeks is a particularly exciting one, with both classes currently studying the popular myth 'Theseus and the Minotaur'. We are also very excited about the forthcoming Greek Day (see separate Parentmail) where we will be dressing up, exploring Greek culture, religion, and taking part in the Olympic games.

What Your Child's Year Group Will Be Learning This Term:

A Greek Odyssey...



As part of our topic on Ancient Greece, we will be looking at myths, discussing the life of Alexander the Great, learning about education and Greek gods, comparing Athens and Sparta, studying maps, pondering the importance of democracy, and talking about the Olympic Games.

In our art lessons we will be exploring the work of David Hockney, creating our own paintings and mixed-media. Over the coming weeks and months we will also be learning about light and electricity, sewing waist-coats, playing goalball, exploring Humanism, Islam and Christianity in R.E, continuing to learn to speak Mandarin, making use of the Jigsaw resources for PSHE and continuing to develop our deeper understanding of mathematics.



Supporting Your Children With Their Homework:

Each Friday, mathematics, punctuation/grammar and spelling homework will appear on the Year 6 Google Classroom page. Both the mathematics homework and the punctuation/grammar questions will relate to the work that the children have completed either that week, or recently, in their lessons. The expectation will be for children to spend around an hour completing the work, and for each child to do the very best that they can, thinking carefully about what has taken place in class. The work needs to be 'turned in' by the following Wednesday. Pupils will be awarded a house point for prompt handing in of their homework, with a further reward being received at the end of the term for consistent completion of the work. The children can further supplement their maths learning by spending time learning their multiplication tables using Times Tables Rock Stars at home. Please see your class teacher if you would like a reminder of your child's log-in details. We will also continue to make use of Spelling Shed. Your child is expected to play games online, based around their weekly spellings. Work completed on their spellings will really help your child to achieve to the best of their ability in their weekly spelling test (the Friday after homework is due in). Pupils are also expected to read regularly at home, with three reads at home (signed for in their reading diaries) being worthy of a house point.

Uniform:

As we begin a new year, can we please remind you that the children need to wear the appropriate school uniform (listed below) on a daily basis. No make-up, nail polish or jewellery should be worn except for simple stud earrings, and long hair should be tied back at all times please. Year 6 children are also encouraged to wear outdoor shoes during break times. This allows us to keep the classrooms as tidy as possible. Our current uniform consists of:

Navy blue crew neck sweatshirt (purchased from PMG Schoolwear) or plain

Navy blue V necked cardigan, (purchased from PMG Schoolwear) or plain

White or navy polo shirt, (purchased from PMG Schoolwear) or plain

Grey school trousers or shorts,

Grey school skirt or pinafore dress,

Dark Navy gingham checked cotton summer dress,

Grey or navy tights, grey socks,

Black school shoes, no training shoes.

PE:

Year 6 PE sessions will take place on **Monday** and **Fridays** each week. Due to our shorter afternoon sessions, we kindly ask that all children come to school on these days wearing their P.E kit. This kit should include:

Navy logo PE shirt (purchased from PMG Schoolwear) – plain navy t-shirt if you prefer,

Navy logo hoodie (purchased from PMG Schoolwear) – plain navy hoodie if you prefer,

Navy shorts,

Navy jogging bottoms,

Training shoes.

Please ensure ALL items of clothing and shoes are clearly named, as this aids a swift return if items are lost.



Water Bottles and Snacks:

Children should have a named water bottle in school. This needs to be taken home every day to be washed out and refilled. We also recommend sending in a piece of fruit or veg for break times; children can get very hungry by lunchtime if they have had nothing to eat mid-morning.
